Rodger and his wife, botanical illustrator Glory Bechtold have been Bull Valley residents since the 1980s and typically spend months every year on Washington Island in Door County where they have a second home and artist studio. Rodger nurtured his interests in the visual arts at the American Academy of Art, Chicago and the School of The Art institute of Chicago. Involved in commercial art illustration for many years he abandoned that pursuit some thirty years ago in favor of painting landscapes full time.

What really ignited this passion for painting was his exposure to mentor Wolf Kahn through the Santa Fe Institute of Fine Art, New Mexico as part of the Masters Art Program. Over time Bechtold has built a solid reputation for being a major contributor to the on-going dialog in contemporary landscape painting in the Midwest and beyond.

His paintings, some monumental in size, have been seen in solo and featured exhibitions in museums and prominent galleries as well as public and private collections across the United States. Rodger's work has been included and discussed in the following books:

Provenance

All of the original oil paintings are the work and property of the artist. The 13 oil paintings were made available to the *Stickney House Foundation* with the sole intention to be offered through auction and for the net proceeds to benefit the foundation as per agreement with the artist. The Board of Trustees of the Village of Bull Valley, together with the Stickney House Foundation as 501(c)(3) not-for-profit organization share a vision about what it means to *Live With the Land* by creating a self-sustaining heritage node that will create an identity for the village and become an important resource for our community as a whole.

The restoration of the historic 1856 Stickney House anchors the larger initiative that includes the relocation of the Village of Bull Valley administrative offices and the police department into the existing barn. The barn will undergo a comprehensive process of adaptive re-use and include community gathering spaces, an event space and critical infrastructure for the village and community of Bull Valley.

The landscapes of the six acre site will be restored and include new trails that will link to existing walking and horse trails. The buildings, landscapes and trail system will become a model of what it means to live *with* the land and become the community node where events, educational programming and resources for our residents are available. The restoration and conservation work are envisioned to take place over a series of incremental but interconnected phases that will reconfigure the property into a self-sustaining asset for the community as a whole.
